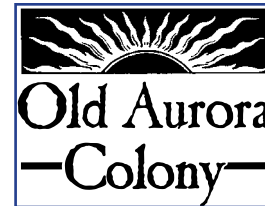

Sixteenth Annual Block Contest
“Bountiful Oregon”

The Old Aurora Colony Museum houses all that remains of a way of life which began in Aurora in 1856. Founded by the dynamic Dr. William Keil and named for his eight year old daughter, Aurora Mills was Oregon’s first and most successful Christian communal society lasting until 1883. Just as the Aurora colonists found a promised “Eden” and Oregon’s bounty at the end of the Oregon Trail, we challenge you to think about Oregon’s bounty as you create your 2010 quilt block.

Our block contest theme for this year is, *“Bountiful Oregon”*. Oregon abounds in natural beauty. Your block should reflect what you love about our great state.

Guidelines

- Unfinished blocks should measure **12 ½” x 12 ½” to finish as a 12” square.**
- Please measure carefully.
- Blocks should be made using a design of your choice.
- Blocks should not be set on point.
- Blocks may be pieced or appliquéd. (if appliquéd, please cut away base fabric)
- Blocks should be made of pre-washed 100% cotton fabrics.

The blocks will be judged first on size, then workmanship and overall appearance. Prizes will be awarded to twenty blocks, which will be used to make up the 2011 raffle quilt. All blocks entered will be used to make quilted items to be sold by ACHS. The proceeds from those sales will benefit the Aurora Colony Historical Society and it’s programs.

To enter: Please enter completed blocks with your name, address, phone number, and the name of your block pattern safety pinned to the back. All blocks will be displayed during the quilt show. Blocks should arrive at the museum no later than Friday, Oct. 22, 2010. Judging will be held after 4:00pm that day. The twenty winners will be displayed Saturday, Oct. 23, 2010 at 11:00am at the Aurora Colony Museum. Blocks may be brought to the Aurora Colony Museum at the corner of Second and Liberty Streets in Aurora or sent to:

38th Annual Quilt Show
Quilt Entry Guidelines
October 15-24, 2010

We are making plans at the Old Aurora Colony Museum for our 38th Annual Quilt Show. Please fill out the Quilt Entry Form if you have a quilt that you would like to display. Quilts may be antique, vintage, contemporary or relate to this year’s quilt show theme, *“Aurora Blue”*. Please complete one form for each quilt submitted.

Quilt Entry Form’s with good quality color photo must be COMPLETED and received no later than September 10, 2010.

QUILT LABELS: All quilts must have an ownership label sewn or securely pinned on the back with the owner’s name, address, telephone # and the size: ____” (top) x ____” (side).

QUILT SLEEVES: We use 1.5-inch wooden dowels to hang quilts, requiring quilts to have a 4” sleeve either sewn or pinned to the back. Directions for making and positioning sleeves are available at the museum.

QUILT CHECK-IN: All quilts **must** arrive at the Aurora Colony Museum, (Corner of 2nd & Liberty Streets, Aurora) **Monday, September 27th, 2010 between 10:00 am and 5:00 pm.**

If this time is inconvenient, please call the museum at 503-678-5754 to make other arrangements. Quilts may also be shipped to the Aurora Colony Museum. Call the museum for shipping instructions. You will be given a receipt at the museum when you bring your quilts. **DON’T LOSE IT!** You must have this receipt in order to pick up your quilts.

QUILT PICK-UP: All quilts should be picked-up at the Aurora Colony Museum, (Corner of 2nd & Liberty Streets, Aurora) **Wednesday, October 27, 2010 between 10:00 am and 5:00 pm.** If this time is inconvenient, please call the museum at 503-678-5754 to make other arrangements.

REMEMBER: YOU MUST BRING YOUR *QUILT RECEIPT* (given when quilts are delivered) TO CLAIM YOUR QUILTS.

Insurance coverage for entries is the sole responsibility of the entrants.

The Aurora Colony Museum reserves the right to decide how the quilts will be displayed. Not all quilts can be hung, they may be folded, draped or displayed with props. We also reserve the right to limit the number of quilts shown per person.
